Feedback Analysis Report

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Principle
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Feedbacks were collected based on the feedback collection policy of the institution and were analysed by the IQAC team. The analysis reports were studied and then the meeting of Internal Board of Studies was called upon to discuss the action that should be taken to improve the curriculum. The institution had tried to enrich the curriculum by increasing the flexibility and involving number of value added courses for effective student learning. The same report was communicated to the RTM Nagpur University for deciding the action plan.



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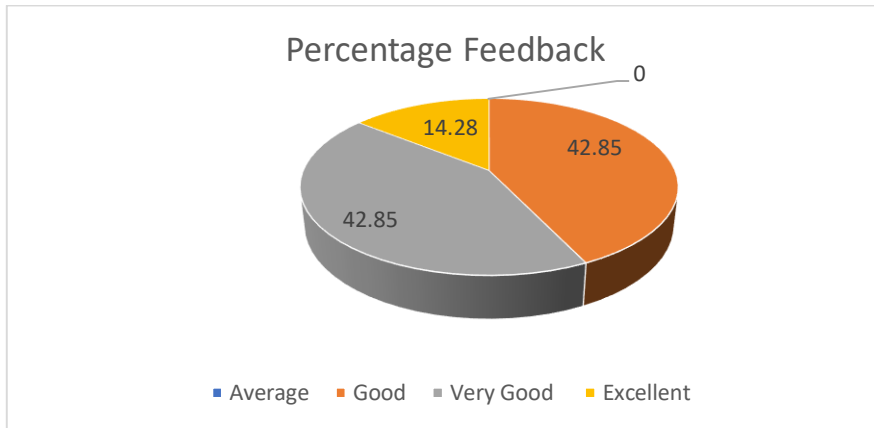
The Feedback on the curriculum was collected from the stakeholders based on the following questionnaire. The response obtained from the stakeholders were collected and analysed to get idea about degree of satisfaction of the stakeholders regarding curriculum. The percentage response are compiled as follows.

Report mentioned that nearly 42.85% of the stakeholders have found the current curriculum suitable for the course. Around 44.4% found that the curriculum is need based. Nearly 44.6% agree that it is in relation with the corresponding reference material. Maximum people found the good balance between theory and application in the current syllabus. 42.7% of the stakeholders found the syllabus helpful in facing professional challenges. Amongst all, 78.32% stakeholders feels that more frequent revision of syllabus and curriculum is needed. Most of the stakeholders, i.e. 91.36% believes that there is a great need of addition of the skill based courses in the curriculum.

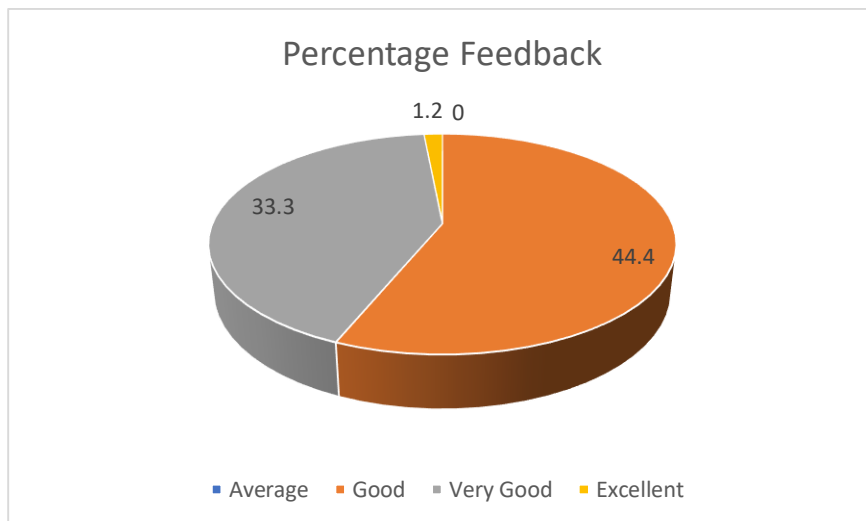
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Q.No. 1: Is Syllabus is suitable to the course?



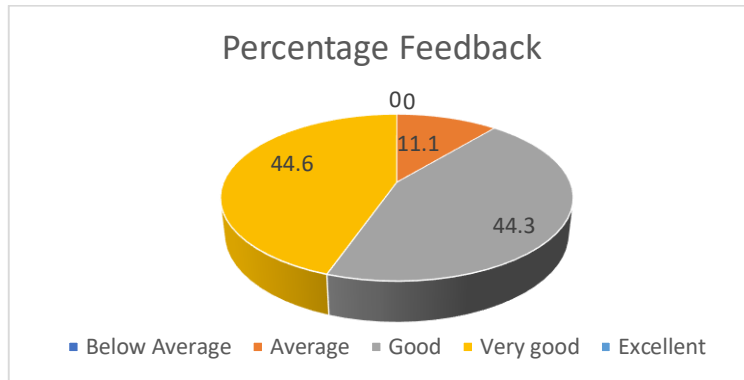
Q.No. 2: Syllabus is need based



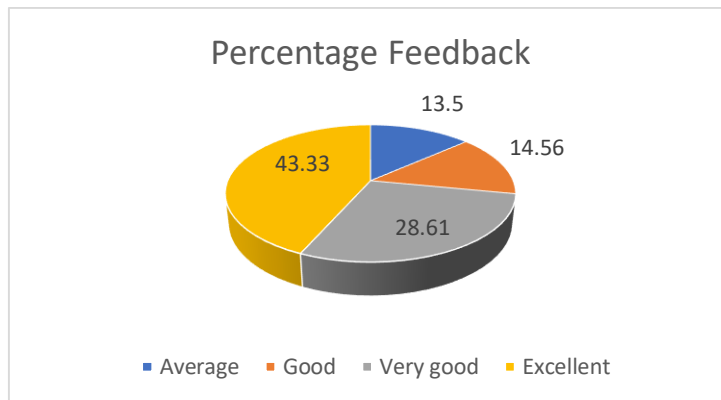
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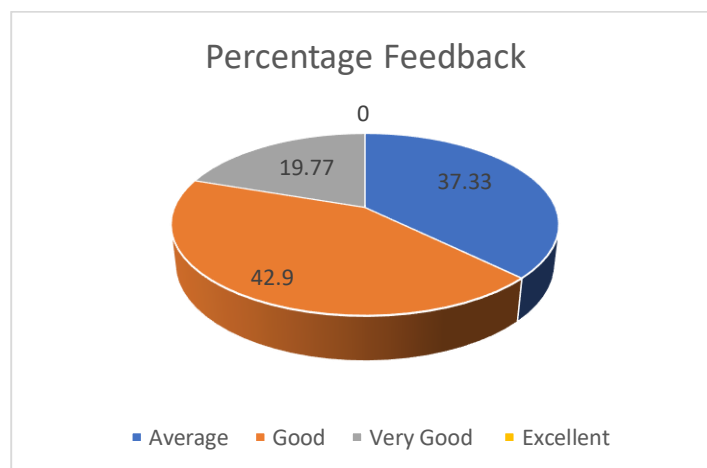
Q.3: Course content is followed by corresponding reference material



Q.4: The course has good balance between theory and applications



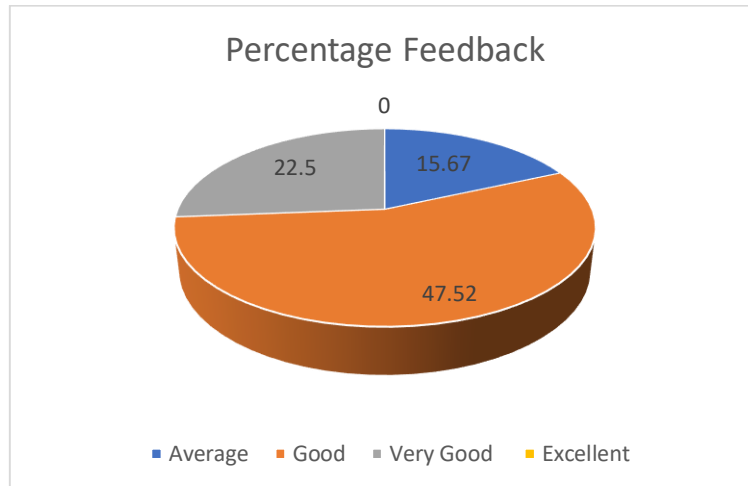
Q.5: No. of Hours allotted for completion of the course is adequate?



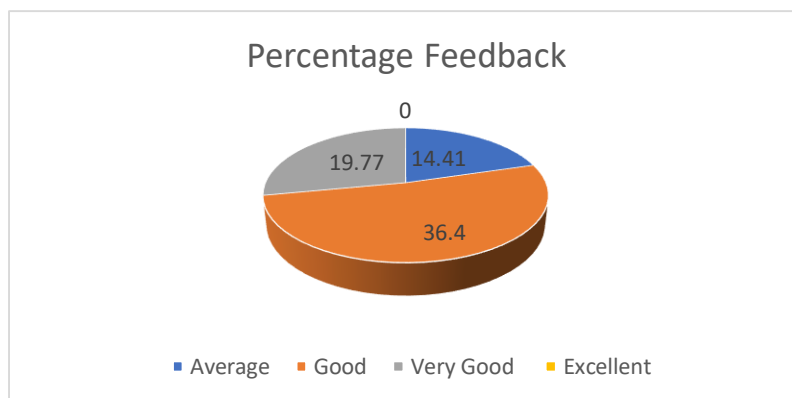
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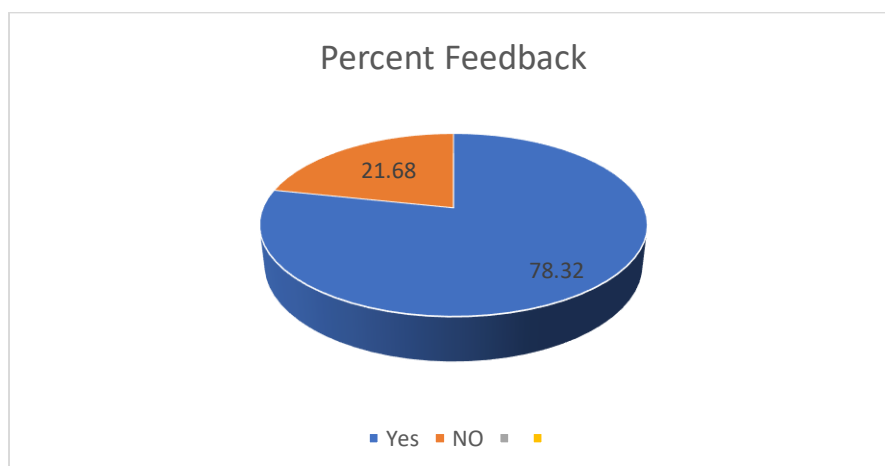
Q.6: Does the course fulfil the skill development of the students as per industrial norms



Q.7: Does the course enable students in facing professional challenges



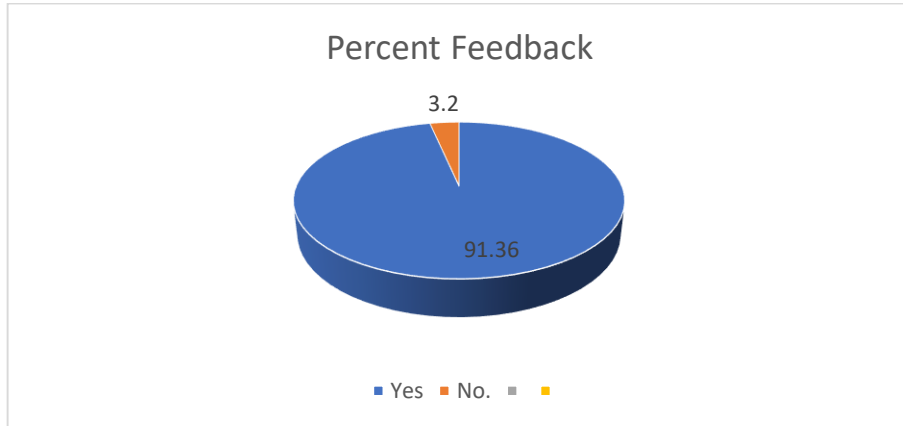
Q.8: Does the syllabus need to be revised more frequently?
